Under normal circumstances the demand would increase when the price drops, however; in snob effect the demand increases when the price increases. For instance, when the price of an expensive arm watch is increased, the demand increases. To sum up, while 'conspicuous consumption' explains the spending of the people in the low income group who try to show their status higher than it is, 'snob effect' explains the unnecessary spending of the people in the high income group who try to show off their status even higher.

Northern lights, which takes its name Aurora Borealis from Aurora who is the goddess of dawn in the Roman mythology, are natural rays which appear in the sky in various forms such as a bow, cloud, straight lines when charged particles that come from the sun interact with the magnetic field of the world. In 1619 Galileo Galilei described these lights by using the name Aurora Borealis and in 1741 Anders Celsius explained his observations that a big magnetic current occurs on times when these rays generate. Northern lights, which is also called 'Polar Lights' in some sources, Aurora Polaris, can be best observed on the dates between September 23 to March 21, and for the most transparent view the weather should be clear and it should be observed at the darkest time of the night. The photographs taken by the Cassini Spacecraft have proved that the Northern Lights are also seen from the other planets. These rays can be best observed from Yellowknife, Canada and Tromsø, Norway. Lastly, Northern Lights can be observed in four different colours. Green belongs to oxygen molecules, Red belongs to oxygen atoms, Blue belongs to nitrogen molecules, and violet/ultraviolet belongs to nitrogen atoms.

Nobody is a hundred percent proactive or reactive and the rate of these characteristics show difference in each individual, however personal traits can be improved and changed. Seasons occur as a natural result of a planet's orbit around its star and its axis tilt. So, in some months of the year, the sun rays come to one hemisphere at a more right angle, while the other hemisphere receives them at a more oblique angle due to the inclination of the axis. Of all the planets, the planet whose seasons are most similar to Earth's is Mars- the fourth planet from the sun-, as its axial tilt is very similar to that of Earth. However, seasons on Mars vary in length because of its eccentric orbit around the sun. In the Northern Hemisphere, spring is the longest season lasting seven months. Summer and fall are both about six months long. Winter is only four months long thus the length of a Martian year is nearly two times longer than what is known as a year on Earth. The surface temperatures of Mars range from -140°C during winter to 20°C during the summer. This great difference in temperature is mainly due to its thin atmosphere's inability to store solar heat sufficiently, low atmospheric pressure and low thermal inertia of the soil.

Around eight million tons of plastic we produce in a year worldwide are carried into the oceans by wind, currents, canals and tides. A recent study conducted by a team of scientists from The University of Barcelona has revealed that *Posidonia oceanica*, a species of seagrass endemic to the Mediterranean, can help trapping and removing plastics in the ocean thanks to its leaf remains. Its fibrous leaves containing lignocellulose fall and these broken pieces form tangled masses known as Neptune balls. Thus these balls trap plastic items that are up to five millimetres in size, and some are ejected from the ocean to land with the help of waves during a storm. Plastic wastes were detected in 17% of 198 Neptune balls which were examined in the study. Approximately 1,500 pieces of plastic waste were found in every one kilogram of these seaballs. Plastic fibres, filaments, and foams were the most common plastic particles trapped in **them**, and polyethylene terephthalate (PET), which is highly used in bottle production, was found in many particles obtained.
